Rector's Reflections

Dear Friends,

The month of May at St. Andrew's has been rich with many opportunities for ministry and mission. Beginning with a memorial service, continuing with the Tween Event Weekend and then The Grand Event, while also preparing to welcome our new Curate and plan the 2017 Farmers Market ministry, and steadily provide feeding ministry, quilting, music, Holy Currencies study, worship, faith formation and finalizing the window project, St. Andrew's has been focused and active in the many ways we seek to Bring Christ to the World and the World to Christ.

I often preach about the importance of worship being the center and grounding from which ministry flows, emphasizing the priority of worship as it motivates and informs all of the activity at St. Andrew's. When we gather for worship, read and hear the Bible in sermons, sing, pray and feast at God's Table together, we become united around God's Love and call. We are then able to "Go in peace to love and serve the Lord." Without exception, the leaders and helpers in the many ministries named above make worship a priority to guide their leadership and service. When one has spent many hours outside of Sunday morning preparing and working in a weekday ministry or event, it might be practical and maybe even reasonable to have devotions at home and then do something else on Sunday morning. It is inspiring for me to observe that at St. Andrew's that is not the practice. Those who serve faithfully in leadership and support outside of worship are also the ones who are faithful in worship participation and leadership. That strong bond between worshipping regularly as a community and serving in a range of ministries is what keeps the ministries grounded in God's Love and keeps St. Andrew's healthy.

The importance of worship in personal spirituality and faith development is named when people share about the reasons they participate in worship at St. Andrew's. I often hear things like, "It helps me get through the week." and "I need it to feel connected to God" and "It makes me feel whole."

Soon our worship rhythm will change for the summer. Beginning on June 10 and continuing through September 9, the Quiet Communion Service at 5 pm will be the regular worship opportunity on Saturdays. The usual offering will be a contemplative and simple structure for exploring the Scripture, praying together and feasting at God's Table. Periodically on Saturdays, the 5 pm Service will be a Concert Mass featuring folk, jazz and other types of music. June 11 marks the beginning of one Sunday morning service at 9:30 am, which will continue through Sept. 10. This service will continue to have congregational music and a Children's Sermon and several services will have special emphases. As the summer rhythm of your household changes, I encourage you to continue to make worship at St. Andrew's a priority. As you gather for worship, read and hear the Bible in sermons, sing, pray and feast at God's Table together, may we continue to be united around God's Love and call.



St. Andrew's Youth Ministry News!





Stewardship 365 group and “Holy Currencies”

In the May Carillon we described our study of the six Holy Currencies: 1) Time and Place, 2) Wellness, 3) Truth, 4) Relationship, 5) Money and, 6) Gracious Leadership. Expanding our view of Stewardship from one currency (money) to six has given us a broader perspective of St. Andrew’s resources and potential.

Sustainable

Holy Currencies are sustainable because they build on each other; this means ministries are built on more than money and are sustainable. In the Cycle of Blessing diagram each Currency flows into the next. For example:

Gracious Leadership shares power, is transparent, and values people over programming. Strong relationships naturally flow from this type of leadership. As relationships grow both understanding and trust increase. Trust leads to better understanding among those within and those outside St. Andrews, and so our knowledge of the Truth increases as well.

When we started our journey in late January, we weren’t quite sure what to expect. We saw the “Circle of Blessings” and wondered what that meant for us at St. Andrew’s. So we dug into our homework and listened and participated in the 6 webinars and discovered a new way to think about what we do here at St. Andrew’s, both internally and externally with our community. The circle or the “flow” of the Holy Currencies is important because just like a river, if there’s no flow, then there is stagnation. We want to be like the River Jordan and not the Dead Sea! To that end, Rev. June, Judi Hudnutt, Lise Day, Bob Sharkody, Joan Van Wormer, Barb Prior and I are continuing to meet to review and discuss not only St. Andrew’s ministries, but our use of our building, our outreach to, and engagement with, our community, and most importantly of all, our members. We want to make sure that our Holy Currencies continue to flow so that we avoid stagnation and instead reach our goal of sustainability of our mission and ministry. If you hear laughter and excitement emanating from Conference Room C on a Wednesday night, it’s us, excited about the possibilities and where the Holy Spirit is guiding us.

Bishop Curry Calls for a Fast.

When did the fast begin? A three-day fast began on Sunday, May 21. We will continue by fasting for one day a month—the 21st of each month—through the close of the 115th Congress at the end of 2018. We fast on the 21st of the month because that is the day when 90% of SNAP benefits run out for families.

Whose fast is this? Make it your own. We hope that many faith communities and other organizations will promote the fast. Different organizations are welcome to promote it among their communities in their own ways. Bread for the World will serve as a facilitation hub for creating resources and sharing ideas and happenings. We hope you will keep the focus on protecting programs to help hungry people struggling with poverty and that you will encourage a monthly fast on the 21st.

Who will be the public face of the fast? You are the face of the fast! Several leaders have already committed themselves to the fast, including David Beckmann, president of Bread for the World; Jim Wallis, convener of Sojourners; Lawrence Reddick, presiding bishop of the Christian Methodist Episcopal Church; and Tony Hall, executive director emeritus of the Alliance to End Hunger. We expect many other leaders at the national and community levels to step forward to be the face of the fast as well.

How do we fast? We are calling for prayer, fasting, and advocacy. Fasting is an effort to clear our bodies, our hearts, and our minds from the distractions around us so that we may draw closer to God. Fasting from food is one option that many will choose. But we invite people to take on the discipline of self-denial, which will help them rely more fully on God. Some may fast from technology, social media, or television.

These days of fasting should also be days of advocacy to oppose cuts to public programs that help hungry people living in poverty. Individuals or congregations who participate in the fast could also write letters to Congress or make financial offerings to support advocacy on days of fasting. Support for a candidate for public office can also be a form of advocacy.

Are there symbols for the fast? We invite people to wear burlap to represent the sackcloth worn by the Jewish people in their time of lamentation. It might be a strip around the wrist. Pastors might wear a stole made of burlap on Sunday morning. St. Andrew's will be exploring ways to do this as a parish and encourage participation beyond.



St Andrew's Fourth Annual Bike Ride and Picnic will be Sunday August 13th.


We will be biking the Ohio and Erie Canal Towpath Trail from Peninsula to Independence. More information about the train/bike ride will be included in the July/August Carillon.
