Rector's Reflections

Dear Church,

October skies in Lorain County have a unique significance for me because they offered such a surprise welcome when we moved to Ohio eight years ago. Richmond friends, who were former Clevelanders, upon learning of our upcoming move, warned about the long gray days in Northeastern Ohio. To hear them tell, most days were overcast with rare bouts of sunshine. What an amazing and wonderful gift to move here and discover the glorious October skies – bright blue with illuminating sunlight and clouds of moving shapes and sizes and to learn that the number of overcast days had been greatly exaggerated. Each year when October comes, with the astonishing beauty of the skies, I am grateful and reminded of that welcome surprise.

October skies are here again and though the world is changing and the pandemic is causing us to shift many of our ways of life and to view the world with a different perspective, we can be reminded of the steadfast Love of God which never changes and is new every morning --- every day.

This Sunday we begin “A Future with Hope”, the financial stewardship campaign where we learn and pray and open our hearts to God’s leading about how each one of us will contribute financially to the life of St. Andrew’s in 2022. The text below, from the Old Testament book of Jeremiah, is a focal point for this campaign and while the type of “exile” we have experienced the past 18 months, was not one in which we were sent by God, it has parallels to the circumstances of God’s people in that day.

Rector's Reflections – continued


