# Rector's Reflections

Dear Church,

An encyclopedia definition of "the Communion of Saints" describes it as "the spiritual union of the members of the Christian Church, living and the dead... a part of the mystical union with Christ as the head, in which each member contributes to the good of all and shares in the welfare of all."\*

I want to dig a bit deeper into the "good of all and shares in the welfare of all" to name it as the Reign of Christ, the Way of Love, that "not yet but also here and now" reality in which we live in and move toward God's dream for the world.

During the early days of the pandemic when the church building was empty, I became aware of the communion of saints in a new way, trusting its presence to hold space in the building and make it holy while it stood empty. Perhaps that was coping mechanism which helped me make peace with the church building standing empty and dark for months on end, knowing that it really wasn't empty. However it functioned, I know that thinking about those who have come and gone before us, in our church and in the world, helps connect me to a larger and hopeful reality, all of God's creatures and Creation.

# **Warming Center Donations!**


